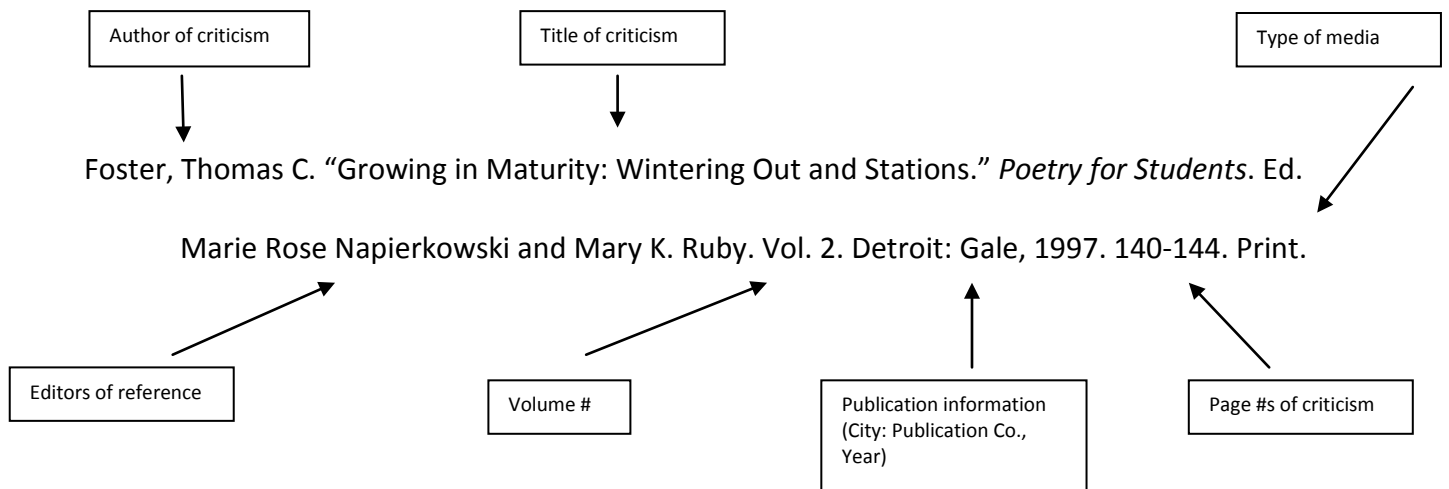


Citing *Poetry for Students*, *DLB* & Supplemental References

According to the 7th Edition of the MLA Handbook, section 5.5.14:

If you are using only one volume of a multivolume work, state the number of the volume in the bibliographic entry (“Vol. 2”) and give publication information for that volume alone; then you need give only page numbers when you refer to that work in the text. (169)

However, citing the inclusive pages numbers at the end of the citation is also acceptable (see MLA Handbook examples on p.169 and examples below). In any event, you must reference the correct page numbers in your parenthetical citation in your text.



The burgundy and navy *American Writers* references works will essentially be cited the same way but instead of a volume number those usually have supplement numbers.
